### M-STEP NEWS

Students in grades 3-8 will be taking the M-STEP in April and May. These computer adaptive, high quality tests assess students in Reading and Writing, Math, and at various grade levels Science and Social Studies. The M-STEP a valuable assessment tool that provides:

An important snapshot of student achievement.

Valuable information to parents on their child's academic achievement.

Important data for teachers, schools, and districts to help guide instruction.

These assessments are required by both state and federal law in order to ensure all children are learning and receiving a high-quality education.

You can help your child be ready for the M-STEP by:

Establishing routine times at home for reading, math fact practice, and homework.

Making sure he or she gets a good night's sleep prior to testing.

Making sure he or she eats breakfast and have snacks and water.

Encouraging him or her to work diligently on the assessment.

# THE CHATFIT CLUB

A PHYSICAL FITNESS CLUB FOR GRADES 4-8

Chatfit Kids Club is based on the mission of fun, mechanics, consistency, and intensity. Consistently good mechanics leads to physical fitness literacy. Numerous resources illustrate exercise is beneficial to physical well being, but also to cognitive function, which can lead to improvements in academic abilities.

Our goal is to provide a fun alternative activity to the traditional sports setting, while teaching proper mechanics and focusing on physical fitness. The program will allow students an opportunity to be active, which will help with all around better health. The program is able to differentiate based on age and individual needs of athletes. Chatfit Club is for students in grades 4-8. The club will meet on Tuesdays after school until 4:30. **Students should be dressed in clean athletic shoes, and clothing that allows easy movement. Clothing must be appropriate for school.** 

Chatfit Club will start on **Tuesday, April 3rd and run until May 29th**. We will meet in the 5th grade classroom area for each session. There will be no Chatfit on Tuesday, April 17th due to parent teacher conferences.

The club will be using foundations based on Crossfit Kids and the Brand X Method. It will be facilitated by Jean Block and Amy Lynch. Students will be using equipment such as dumbbells, kettlebells, medicine balls, and barbells with weights.

The cost to join Chatfit Club is \$25 per student. A family of two will be discounted to \$40 and families of three students will be discounted to \$65.

Dear Parent,

Beginning in mid-April, your school district will administer the Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress (M-STEP) to students in grades 3-8. The M-STEP will be given online to nearly all students and will measure student knowledge of Michigan's high academic standards in English language arts (ELA), mathematics, science, and social studies.

High school students in grades 9 and 10 will continue to take the PSAT to provide schools, students, and parents valuable information on what students know in ELA and mathematics. It also helps students prepare for the SAT college entrance exam given to high school juniors as part of the Michigan Merit Examination (MME).

Students in grade 11 will take the MME, which consists of a free SAT that also measures student knowledge on Michigan's English language arts and mathematics standards; M-STEP science and social studies components; and a work skills assessment called WorkKeys.

We all want your child's state assessment experience to be as relaxed and stress-free as possible. Your positive outlook and supportive manner going into these assessments also will influence your child's experience.

Remember, testing is a part of learning. State assessment results do not impact student grades. They are designed to provide information on student knowledge and ability to be career- and college-ready upon graduation. Schools and district use the results for curriculum planning and school improvement initiatives that benefit all students.

M-STEP testing time has been significantly reduced since its first year, with further reductions made for 2018. In fact, students—on average—will spend no more than 3 hours on state tests in math and English language arts. Students in 5<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade who take state assessments in science and social studies will spend an additional two hours on those tests. Even so, 2018 state assessments *in total* take up less than 1 percent of total instructional time for the school year.

While we support parents in making choices for their children, there is no allowable way in state or federal law to "opt out" of state assessments. Students who are not assessed will count against their schools' participation rate, and create an incomplete picture of school performance. Schools rely on accurate test results to focus on students or

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programs that may need more academic support. That's one reason federal law requires a 95% participation rate target on state assessments be used in a school's accountability rating.
