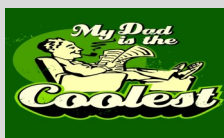
BOGO BOOK FAIR

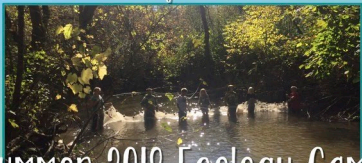
CHATFIELD SCHOOL PRIDE ASSEMBLY AND EVENING OF PRIDE

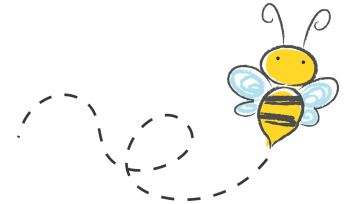
Have Fun with your Family While exploring the Joys of Gardening at The Willows at Chatfield School

All student-athletes participating in athletics at Chatfield will be required to have a sports physical on file for the 2018-2019 school year. Sports physicals will be hosted at Chatfield on Thursday, May 17th from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. as well as another in late July/early August. The cost for a sports physical is \$10 with 100% of the proceeds being donated back to the athletic department by the physicians volunteering their services.

The first day of practice will be on Monday, August 28th with the time TBD by Coach Kress. Once games begin, practices will be right after school (at 3:45 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.) and on Mondays and Wednesdays. All participants will receive a hooded sweatshirt (which is included in the cost for the cheer season). The Chatfield Athletic Department will also provide each girl a "school-issued cheer uniform" for the season which needs to be returned at the completion of the flag football and cheer season. In addition, each girl will receive a hair bow and spank as part of their uniform that will be theirs to keep at the end of the cheer season.

The first day of practice will be on Monday, August 13th with the time to be decided by the coaches and announced via email or phone call. Practices will be held Monday through Friday prior to the 2018-2019 school year beginning at the end of August. Once games begin, practices will be right after school (at 3:45 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.) and on Mondays and Wednesdays.

All student-athletes participating in athletics at Chatfield will be required to have a sports physical on file for the 2018-2019 school year. Sports physicals will be hosted at Chatfield on Thursday, May 17th (6:00 to 8:00 p.m.) as well as another in late July/early August. The cost for a sports physical is \$10 with 100% of the proceeds being donated back to the athletic department by the physicians volunteering their services.

All flag football games begin at 4:30 p.m. (on Tuesdays/Thursdays) in September and October. The LCFFL Jamboree and Bachman Bowl will be played on Saturday, October 13th (with games beginning at 12:00 and the championship game at 6:30). All players will need white football (or baseball) pants without any stripes for the games during the season. Mouth guards will also be required for participation in the sport. If the participant doesn't have one, they will be provided "one" for the season by the athletic department.

There is a "Sports Physical Night" at Chatfield on May 17th (6:00-8:00 p.m.) for any student-athlete needing a sports physical for the 2018-2019 school year. Cost of the examination is \$10 and 100% of fees will be donated back to The Chatfield Athletic Department.
