ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Dear Parents and Students:

The City of Lapeer has notified the school of two local road construction projects that may impact your commute to Chatfield.

The first is the resurfacing of DeMille Boulevard from Harrison (the light by Kroger Gas station and the movie theater) west to the turnarounds on the divided road.

The estimated start date is May 22, 2017. It appears that the road will be totally closed during this project. A suggested route for anyone effected by this construction is to take M-24 to M-21 then turn left onto Lake Dr. However, M-24 is under construction at this time and may cause delays as well.

The second project is the resurfacing of M-24 from Nepessing Street to Davis Lake Rd.. This project has already begun. Millville Road is a good alternative route.

As always, our focus is on the education of our students. Please be aware of these road construction projects and the additional time it may add to your commute to Chatfield.

Please remember that students need to be in the classroom by 8:20 am when instruction begins. We will do our best to keep you informed of any changes to these projects.


NOT RETURNING TO CHATFIELD
