DRESS CODE Reminder

Clothing worn to school should be appropriate for health, safety and the orderly conduct of classroom learning. We expect parents to take note of what their child is wearing to school. In addition, students are expected to adhere to standards of cleanliness and dress that are compatible with the requirements of a good learning environment.

Students are expected to follow the fingertip rule regarding length when wearing shorts or skirts. When standing up straight and the student's hand and arm are fully extended at side, the length of shorts must be longer than the longest finger. There is to be no exposed midriffs. Necklines must be modest. Straps on tops must be at least three fingers wide. Pants cannot be worn low enough to expose underwear. Tank tops and undershirts are not acceptable. Shirts cannot have inappropriate graphics or wording. Outerwear, such as hoods/hats are not to be worn

When clothing is considered inappropriate, the parent will be notified. The student will not be allowed to remain in class and will be allowed to return to class only when clothing is changed.
