Classroom Corner

MATH: Each day your child will receive a math assignment. Please check your child's classroom calendar to stay informed on what lesson your child is completing.

SOCIAL STUDIES: Students will continue to examine the five themes of geography: Location, Place, Movement (of people and goods), Human-Environment Interaction and Regions. Students will apply their understanding of Human-Environment Interaction, Movement and Place by completing a study titled, "Human Footprint". This study will involve an analysis of our footprint on Earth. Students will also examine the consumption and production of goods and how this relates to the movement and location of people. Finally, students will review Earth's hemispheres, latitude and longitude and examine different types of maps.

SCIENCE: In Science, students begin the Solid Earth Unit of study. Students will learn the cause and effects of earthquakes and volcanoes. Students should also have an understanding how natural forces, such as earthquakes and volcanoes are constantly changing and reshaping earth's surface. Additionally, students will learn about earth's structure and complete a study of the three types of rocks: Igneous, Metamorphic and Sedimentary. Students will also learn about the effects of weathering and erosion on earth's surface.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS:Students will begin the novel study, <u>Tuck Everlasting</u>, by Natalie Babbit. .As a class we will read and discuss each chapter. Students are expected to respond in writing for each day's reading to check for understanding and comprehension of the text. In writing, students will learn the fundamentals to composing an argument paragraph. Additionally, students will learn how to develop different types of sentences, use commas correctly and cite facts from outside sources.
