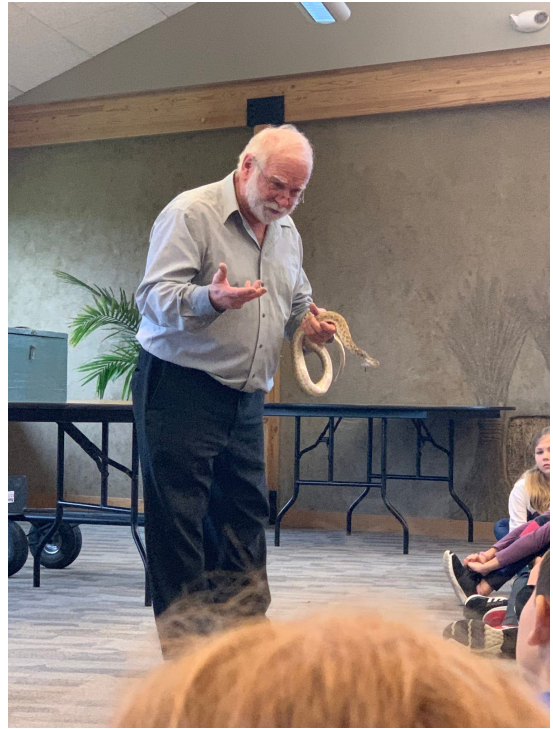
#### Classroom Fall Festivities

#### Costume Expectations

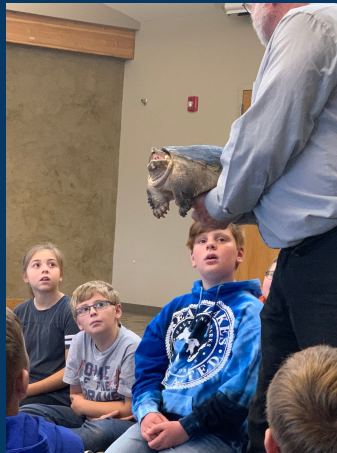
